May General Meeting Minutes

Held in conjunction with the May Day feast. No attendance taken.

Coille Stoirmeil (Kori and Lilith): the Canton is marking its 25th anniversary next year, so we will do a grand celebration that combines Feast of the Beast and TMT. The event is tentatively planned for April 21 (with setup on the 20th, and clean up on the 22nd). We plan to use the Tomah Fairgrounds. The feast menu includes five removes with five dishes in each remove (and is based on Feast of the Beast menus). Because of the higher-than-usual workload, we are looking for co-stewards from the Barony to assist us (the Canton will generally supply the steward). In particular, we are looking for stewards from the Barony for Games, Lunch, Servers, Washing, Ball Master/Mistress, Sunday Breakfast, and Cleaning; as well as volunteers to help with setup/takedown, kitchen, and washing. Contact Seonag if you are interested.

Pottery Guild (Chiere): we had our first gathering of the pottery guild and it was well attended and turned out well. We need to get the next one scheduled. I would like to have a regular schedule. If you were interested, give me input on when a good time will be. I should have a schedule in place by next week.

High Seat (Eithni): the equestrian event yesterday was a wonderful opportunity to experience equestrian activities.

Coronation (Marion): we had about 400 people attend the event. If you have any receipts, get them in soon. Right now, it looks like we made about \$1700-1800 on the event (which will be split with the Kingdom).

Alienor (Chatelaine): newcomers are busy and keeping me busier! I have found a deputy (Chiere) who will help relieve the workload.

Wulfhomm (Michaeus): Wulfhomm has a demo in June and we would like to borrow the TW loaner gear for the Baronial competition.

Last fall, we gave the Kiwanis a donation, but it got lost. We need to get it cancelled and have a replacement created (the Canton will cover the \$30 cancellation cost). **[Barony approved]**

Baronial Transition (Robert): this December will mark three years that Eithni has sat on the throne, and her term of office will be up. Because of the steps involved, we wanted to start the process now to choose a new high seat.

As first order of business, does Jararvellir still want to be a barony? (Why not a kingdom? [much laughter]) **[Meeting voted to approve decision to stay a barony unanimously]**

Three year term. Why 3 year term and why no vote of confidence to extend (as other baronies do)? Four years was seen as too long. Vote of confidence was removed because it was seen as too personal. Some thought expressed that we have changeover too often (Windhaven has them every 3 years but others do 4 years or none at all). No changes proposed.

Proposal to remove reference to "principality law" from charter.

Timeline for transition process: have set up timeline to happen within the next reign. Concern expressed about getting word out to students/newcomers before they leave for summer. **Robert will create a single sheet description of the process and plan to distribute to students.** This will also be for distribution at guild meetings.

If there are more than three candidates, the Barony will hold an informal poll. This polling will be distributed at the late August moot and votes will be due by 8/31.

Baronial Charter

This is the current Baronial Charter, as discussed and approved during Jararvellir's General Meetings during the baronial transition meetings in the Winter of 2003, and amended during General Meeting on April 30, 2006.

Job Description

The position of baron and baroness is the highest honor that the barony can offer. The position may be occupied by a couple, or by a single individual serving as baron or baroness.

Job duties. The baron and baroness serve as a focus for baronial ceremonies and as a baronial presence at events. They should help to recognize the projects and accomplishments of members of the barony, through making award recommendations and holding courts. The baron and baroness are servants of the people of the barony and should be accessible to the people. The baron and baroness should be active on a local and regional level. The baron and baroness must adhere to applicable kingdom law and Corpora in carrying out their duties.

Suggested Skills and Experience. The baron and baroness should lead by example and project a good "medieval model". They should possess good communication and diplomatic skills, a sense of humor, and the ability to remain objective and/or neutral. The baron and baroness should be familiar with kingdom law and Corpora. They should be extroverted and capable of public speaking. They should be willing to take on the extra work involved in serving as baron and baroness.

Term of Office (length of each term).

The barony sets forth a term of office of three years. Pursuant to that decision, baronial policy that a new election/polling process for baron and baroness is automatically held every three years. The three-year term may not be extended by a vote of confidence or other means.

Term Limits (number of consecutive terms).

The barony chooses not to establish any limits on the number of times an individual or couple may run for and serve as baron or baroness if chosen by the Crown.

Voting by Non-Members

Initial internal polling (if needed) will be open to all, regardless of membership status.

Vacancy: Thrown Weapons Marshall

The Thrown Weapons Marshal is responsible for the safe set up, and operation of the Barony's thrown weapon practices. The Marshal is also responsible for the Barony's thrown weapon equipment. You must either be a TW Marshal or MIT (or willing to become one) in order to hold this position. If interested, please contact John Bartholomew of Flanders (Jack) at jbf@pobox.com or 257-1082.

- 1527 - The Florentines drive out the Medici for a second time and Florence re-establishes a republic.
- May 17, 1220: King Henry III of England Crowned – again. Henry, who had been crowned at age nine (four years earlier), underwent a second coronation at Westminster.
- May 18, 1152 - Henry II marries Eleanor of Aquitaine
- 1593 - Playwright Thomas Kyd's accusations of heresy lead to an arrest warrant for Christopher Marlowe.
- May 19, 1535 - French explorer Jacques Cartier sets sail on his second voyage to North America with three ships, 110 men, and Chief Donnacona's two sons (whom Cartier kidnapped during his first voyage).
- May 20, 685 - The Battle of Nechtansmere is fought between a Pictish army under King Bridei III and the invading Northumbrians under King Ecgrith, who are decisively defeated.
- 1217 - Second Battle of Lincoln is fought near Lincoln, England, resulting in the defeat of Prince Louis of France by William Marshal, 2nd Earl of Pembroke.
- 1570 - Cartographer Abraham Ortelius issues the first modern atlas.
- May 21, 996: Sixteen-year-old Otto III is crowned Holy Roman Emperor. Otto and his friend, Pope Sylvester II, had great plans for the Holy Roman Empire that sadly never came to pass. He did not survive past his 21st year.
- 1502 - Island of Saint Helena discovered by Portuguese navigator João da Nova.
- May 22, 1176 - Murder attempt by the Hashshashin (Assassins) on Saladin near Aleppo.
- May 23, 1498 - Girolamo Savonarola is executed on the orders of Pope Alexander VI
- 1533 - Marriage of King Henry VIII to Catherine of Aragon is declared void.
- 1541 - Jacques Cartier leaves St-Malo, France on his third voyage.
- 1555 - Paul IV becomes Pope.
- May 24, 1153 - Malcolm IV becomes King of Scotland.
- 1218 - The Fifth Crusade leaves Acre for Egypt.
- 1276 - Magnus Ladulås crowned King of Sweden in Uppsala Cathedral.
- May 25, 1085 - Alfonso VI of Castile takes Toledo back from the Moors.
- 1420 - Henry the Navigator is appointed governor of the Order of Christ.
- 1521 - The Diet of Worms ends when Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor, issues the Edict of Worms, declaring Martin Luther an outlaw.
- May 26, Whitsun was originally the feast of Pentecost, around which a great many christenings would occur, so it became associated with the color white. It is one of the Scottish quarter days (days on which servants were hired, and rents and rates were due.)
- May 27, 1199: King John I of England crowned
- May 28, 1503 - James IV of Scotland and Margaret Tudor are married by Pope Alexander VI according to Papal Bull.
- 1503 - The Treaty of Everlasting Peace between Scotland and England is signed, which would actually last 10 years.
- May 29, 1453: Constantinople falls to the Turks. After a siege lasting weeks, the forces of Mehmed II at last breached the walls that had stood impenetrable for more than a thousand years, and the city fell. With the Fall of Constantinople, the Eastern Roman Empire (Byzantium) was no more.
- May 30, 1434 - Taborite forces led by Prokop the Great were defeated and almost annihilated in the Battle of Lipany, effectively ending the Hussite Wars.
- 1574 - Henry III becomes King of France.

The Anti - Calendar

(A listing of events that have already happened)
Compiled by Reinholdt von Trollenhagen

- May 1, May Day/Beltane. Beltane or Beltaine is an ancient Gaelic holiday celebrated around May 1, the traditional first day of summer in Ireland. It falls close to midpoint in the Sun's progress between the Vernal Equinox and Summer Solstice. May 5 (Old Beltane) is the actual astronomical date. It is an English cross-quarter day (a holiday derived from the Celtic calendar).
- May 2, 1194 - King Richard I of England gives Portsmouth its first Royal Charter.
1335 - Otto the Merry, Duke of Austria, becomes Duke of Carinthia.
- May 3, 1494 - Christopher Columbus first spots Jamaica.
- May 4, 1493 - Pope Alexander VI divides the New World between Spain and Portugal along the Demarcation Line.
- May 5, 1260 - Kublai Khan becomes ruler of the Mongol Empire.
- May 6, 1527 - Spanish and German troops sack Rome; some consider this the end of the Renaissance.
1536 - King Henry VIII orders Bible be placed in every church.
- May 8, 1429: Siege of Orléans Ends. This siege of the Hundred Years' War had begun on Oct.12, 1428, and was at last lifted when Joan of Arc persuaded King Charles VII of France to send an army to relieve the city. Thanks to diversionary action against one of the English forts, Joan herself was able to enter Orléans with supplies on April 30, and in the days that followed the principal English forts were stormed. The English then abandoned the siege.
- May 10, 1291 - Scottish nobles recognize the authority of King Edward I of England.
1497 - Amerigo Vespucci allegedly leaves Cádiz for his first voyage to the New World.
- May 11, 330: Constantinople inaugurated. After an intensive expansion project, the old Greek town of Byzantium was renamed for the emperor Constantine and made the capital of the empire. For more than 1000 years, Constantinople is the most culturally advanced and politically significant city of the west.
- May 12, 1191 - Richard I of England marries Berengaria of Navarre.
1264 - The Battle of Lewes, between King Henry III of England and the rebel Simon de Montfort, 6th Earl of Leicester, begins.
1328 - Antipope Nicholas V, a claimant to the papacy, is consecrated in Rome by the Bishop of Venice.
- May 13, 1497 - Pope Alexander VI excommunicates Girolamo Savonarola.
- May 14, 1264: Henry III captured at Battle of Lewes In a revolt prompted by Henry's refusal to implement the Provisions of Oxford, Henry was captured by Simon de Montfort in this battle in Sussex.
1509 - Battle of Agnadello: In northern Italy, French forces defeat the Venetians.
- May 15, 1264: Henry, Duke of Bavaria crowned King of Germany
1525 - The battle of Frankenhausen ends the Peasants' War.
- May 16, 1204: Baldwin crowned Latin emperor. Baldwin participated in the capture of Constantinople during the infamous Fourth Crusade, helped install the pro-Latin emperor Alexius IV Angelus, then seized power himself with Venetian support. He was crowned in the Hagia Sophia, and soon recognized by Pope Innocent III, but his reign was tumultuous and short-lived.

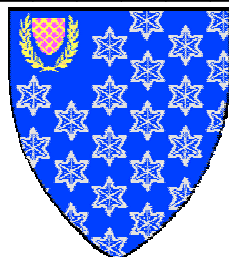

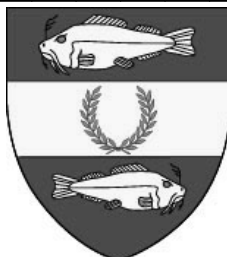

opponents by a similar margin. Coronation

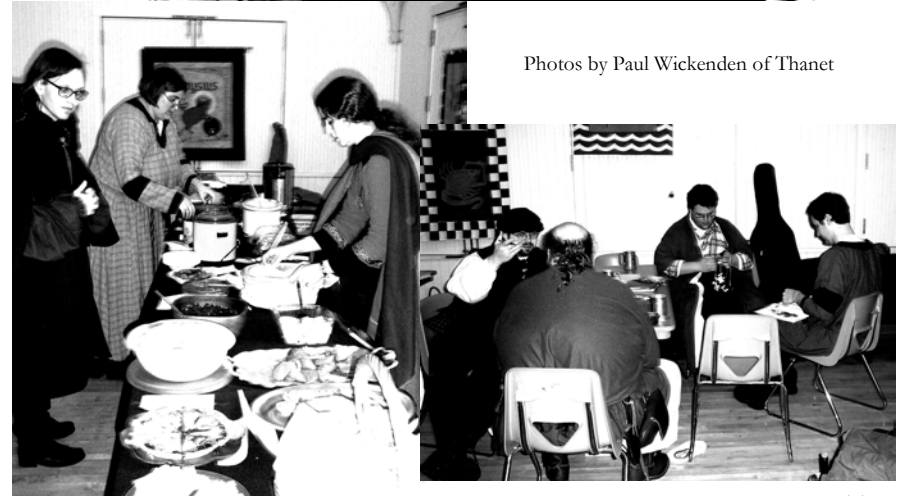
