**Coronation (Papa):** We have 22 reservations for Coronation

**Archery Brunch (Sol):** This is no archery brunch this month. If you are interested in hosting one in the future, please let me know.

**May Day (Nakamochi):** I am looking for helpers for May Day. Looking for volunteers to teach classes and to assist with the event overall. May Day will be held on April 30th in Olin Park.

**Coronation (Marian):** the staff visited the site this afternoon and went over where things will situate. I have list of crew chiefs and have found site tokens. I will order 500 of them. Things are on track with four weeks left to go.

It should be fascinating if nothing else! Soon thereafter we will be hosting Coronation. This upcoming weekend is Fighters School in Windhaven, where there will also be an investiture for their new baron and baroness. I am working on a gift basket. If you have something to gift their excellencies, please get it to me. I am taking the remnants of garb closet to Glenn Abhainn (10 boxes of garb) and need help carrying them down.

**Rapier (Eithni):** Rosa thought she was the rapier marshall, but this process was not started. So, this is the official announcement that **the position of baronial rapier marshall is becoming vacant. If you are interested, contact Mateo.**

**Brewing and Vintning (Robert):** We will be having Beer Appreciation at JT Whitnys on March 13 at 7pm.

**Seneschal (Robert):** I will be out of town from March 19-25. Because I don't have a deputy yet, any serious issues that come up during that time (and that cannot wait) should go to the regional deputy.

**Northshield Donations (Robert):** It has been a while since we last made a donation. Based on the proceeds from WW, I'm proposing \$500 (split between the crown and heirs' travel fund). Eithni can present it at Fighters School this weekend, so they can have the money to help cover the costs of Gulf Wars. **[Meeting approved the donation]**

**Data Retention Policy (Robert):** Do we want a policy in place for secondary storage of baronial records? Need some method to ensure that our only copies of certain records (like the directory) do not disappear. Not necessary for all officers, just those that are critical. **[Decision: the Seneschal will be responsible for working with critical officers to acquire backups that he will keep in a fire safe at his home]** I will look into cost of fire safe for next meeting.



**Northshield Business Cards (Robert):** A new call has gone out for ordering business cards. Do we think we should do them? Eithni and Marian found them helpful and have used up most of theirs. **[Meeting approved purchasing cards for Seneschal, Baroness, and Chatelaine (if she needs them)]**

**Equestrian Event (Paul):** The event discussed last month is scheduled for April 29th, but we have no idea on the budget. Eithni will check with Arienh.

**Pottery Guild (Chiere):** Is there interest in starting one? There is a place in Cottage Grove where we could do it. There would be a cost involved to cover supplies [see page 17 of this Skein for details] but it is reasonable and there is a group discount.

**Wulfhomm (Michaeus) [sent by email]:** March 3rd marks the fifth anniversary of Wulfhomm. As of yet we don't have anything planned for a celebration.

We will be having its regular monthly meeting on Thursday night at 7pm at the Monroe Library in the downstairs meeting room.

Wulfhomm will be having a demo again this year on Saturday, June 17th in conjunction with the annual Monroe Balloon Rally and A Taste of Monroe. The location will be the same as previous years (on the north side of the courthouse square in downtown Monroe). It starts at 10am and goes until about 2:30-3pm. ## **Pavilion and Shade Fly Workshop**

March 18 — 9am -early evening — Edgewood College

Have you always wanted a more medieval camp site? Do you wonder what it would take to sew a pavilion or a shade fly? Come find out at the Pavilion and Shade Fly Workshop in Jararvellir. Maestra Giovanna will be teaching by example.

Site Fee: Donations accepted (will go towards beverages and snacks, site is free)

Pre-registration: not necessary, but send Iohanna a quick note if you want to attend (rturmer@library.wisc.edu; 608-628-7638 (cell); 608-238-3894 (home)).

The workshop will include making a wedge tent or two and shade flies. The wedge tents are already claimed, but the workshop will teach you how to make your ideal tent and Giovanna will be happy to help you design that tent. If you would like to make a shade fly, you will need to bring the following supplies:

1. Sturdy sewing machine (old Singer or Kenmore)
2. 12 yards cotton duck or trigger at 60" wide - Giovanna recommends using colored fabric (do not use natural or white as it tends to mildew).
3. Thread
4. Size 16-18 needles
5. Basic sewing supplies - scissors, sewing machine maintenance stuff (bobbins, screwdriver, cleaning brushes, etc.)

# The Anti -Calendar

(A listing of events that have already happened)  
Compiled by Reinholdt von Trollenhagen

March 2, 986: Louis V becomes King of the Franks.

March 4, 1152: Frederick I elected Holy Roman Emperor. He was also known as "Barbarossa" (red-beard).

March 6, 1454: Thirteen Years' War: Delegates of the Prussian Confederation pledged allegiance to Casimir IV of Poland, and he agreed to help in their struggle for independence from the Teutonic Knights.

March 14, 1489: The Queen of Cyprus, Catherine Cornaro, sells her kingdom to Venice.

March 15, 933: Henry I of Germany defeats Magyars. In 924, Henry agreed to pay tribute to the Magyars in exchange for a nine-year halt to raids on German lands. During this truce, he built fortified towns and trained cavalry.

In 933, Henry refused to renew the tribute and his seasoned army destroyed the Magyars at Riade.

March 18, 1229: Frederick II crowns himself king of Jerusalem in the Church of the Holy Sepulchre.

March 24, 1603: James VI of Scotland also becomes James I King of England.

March 27, 1306: Robert I of Scotland and Elizabeth de Burgh are crowned king and Queen of the Scots.

1351: The Battle of the Thirty. This battle in the struggle for succession to the duchy of Brittany was so called because each side chose thirty knights to engage in combat. Though the battle settled nothing, it became the basis of troubadour legends and was retold in the chronicles of Froissart.

March 28, 845: Paris is sacked by Viking raiders, probably under Ragnar Lodbrok, who collects a huge ransom in exchange for leaving.

March 30, 1282: The people of Sicily rebel against the Angevin king Charles I, in what becomes known as the Sicilian Vespers.
