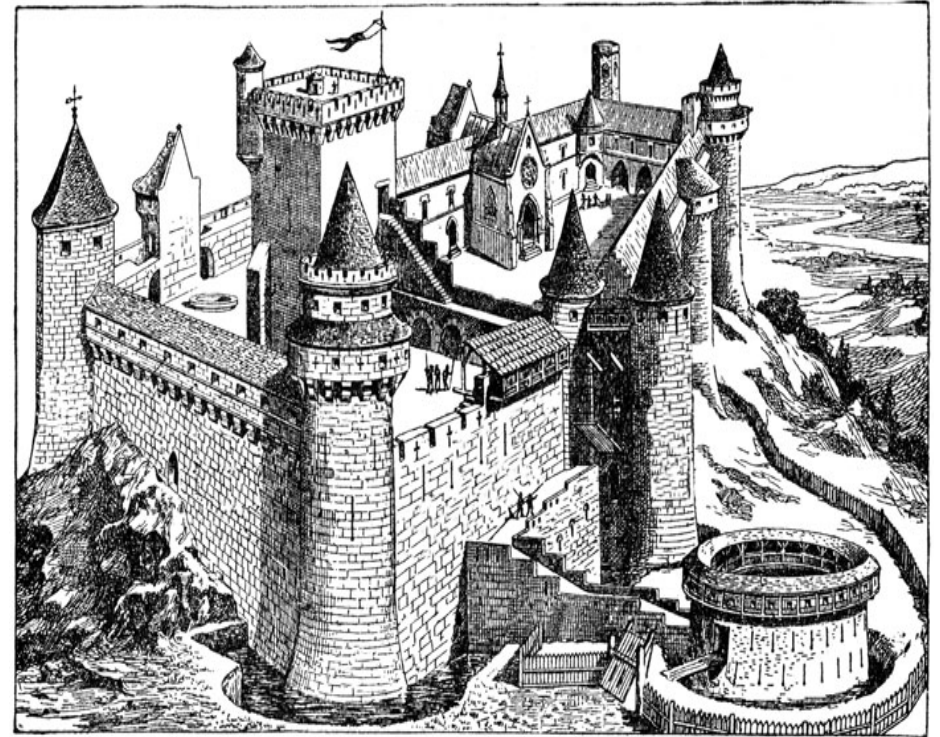

**WW Relocation (Yseult):** Last year Marv notified us that our contract would not be renewed in 2008 and that he was planning to change NCN Campground into an adult-only site, but we expected this transition to be slow. In May Marv sent out a national press release that resulted in several newspaper articles. On May 23rd the event stewards received a communication from the Board of Directors that we needed to change to a new site because the adults-only emphasis is contrary to the SCA's family-oriented non-profit policy. We removed WW property from the site to a storage locker in Tomah on Memorial Day and SCA, Inc. sent Marv a letter

Now that the dust is settling in the frantic search to find a new site (special thanks to our Autocrat team who put in a lot of extra hours, miles, and a bit of blood/sweat/tears to find a site only a week after finding that they needed one), it's time to start beating the bushes (er, make that ...ask nicely) to see if we can find volunteers to work Info Point. This year, HE Kindorn Broadbelt and I have agreed to work on this together and we're hoping to have a lot of fun in doing it.

Inquiring minds want to know, probably more this year than in the past, what's going on at WW XIV?! If YOU want to know, sign up for a shift at Information Point! Stay on top of the day's activities and changes, help people know what services are available in the new area, etc.

We will have the Point open from 8am to 6pm and are asking for volunteers to work 2 hour stints (already have our first volunteer, THANK YOU, ERILAR). notifying him that we are canceling the contract. If Marv sues us, the SCA, Inc. will represent us in court but we will probably be liable for any damages.

**WW Site (Yseult):** The autocrats set a June 5 deadline to find a new site and Eithni conducted the preliminary contact with Chippewa Falls Music Festival grounds, in Cadott north of Eau Claire. The site is 210 acres located on both sides of CTH S, three times the size of NCN Campground. We will be using only one side for WW and the size and facilities at this location allow for the least disruption of WW activities. The camping area consists of a flat open area with large rows divided by gravel roads, very similar to the Serengeti at the old site or Lillies War. There are 38 showers but no septic system and no electrical hookups for general camping. People who need medical access to electricity will be able to camp in the handicapped camping area. A private concessions stand has firewood available and fires are allowed only in fire rings with no digging of fire pits allowed. However, we still don't know what all of the site policies during our event will be. Camping rules will be the same as in previous years and will continue in the foreseeable future since both Jararvellir and Nordskogen feel strongly about landocrat allocation policies.

**WW Finances (Yseult):** We got a great deal for the new site: it will be about \$9 per person for parking, garbage removal, portapodies, etc. which means we could potentially make up to \$10,000 in profit. However, we lost the \$1000 deposit at NCN Campground. We may also need to pay the remaining \$4000 for this year and an additional \$5000 for the 2008 portion of the broken contract. We also don't know many of the costs associated with the new site. We will need to rent a truck to move WW property between the site and the storage locker, and we may still need to conduct a long-term site search. Nor do we know if attendance will drop this year. We finalized the site contract one day before newsletter deadlines so we did not have time to discuss changing the fee structure in the event ads. **[Meeting discussed the uncertain financial situation and voted to keep the current fee structure. If we make an unusually large profit we can donate the excess income, if we have significant costs we will have sufficient funds to cover them]**

**WW Information (Yseult):** We thank people for being patient and giving us space to deal with the sudden site issues. If you have potentially useful information about WW and the site, please run it by the autocrats before generally sharing it and please refer to the WW website for official information. The autocrats chose not to direct people to the Countryfest website because it is unclear how many of the rules for that event will apply to WW. We also didn't realize how many SCA forums are out there until someone showed us an ad for WW on SCA Today. We want to make sure everyone has access to the most current and correct information, and the WW website is being updated as fast as we can arrange. We will provide a FAQ to inform people about the specific differences between the sites and the local resources available.

**WW Staff (Yseult):** Site walk-through will most likely occur on Saturday June 17. We can begin setting up on Sunday before the event.

**ARRG VI (Leona):** We've done this event through Jararvellir the past two years and will probably continue that. Sixty people attended, six were non-members. Many people stayed in cabins. No real problems during the event, except with Troll. Next year we will probably dedicate one non-fencer to run Troll and set one time period for check-in rather than having it open all day. Total of site fees was \$318, but need to refund money to one person. **[Leona turned over gate monies to the exchequer]**

**Webminister (Robert):** We have three candidates: Drachon, Leona, Lancelot who just moved into the barony from Ohio (and James who is interested primarily in redesigning the site). Robert recommends Drachon who has been doing a good job as interim Webminister. At the next meeting the three candidates will have an opportunity to present themselves and give a spiel. **[vote will be held at July meeting]**

**Known World Costuming Handbook receipts (Eithni):** She overlooked some old receipts to submit to the exchequer. **[Fiona said as long as they are from 2007 they can be reimbursed]**

**Demo Coordinator (Reinholdt):** He introduced Annora le Spindlere who has attended many demos and volunteered to take over as demo coordinator. **[vote will be held at July meeting]**

**It's Only A Flesh Wound (Kristin):** Site is confirmed and deposit paid. Even though the event is seven months away we are already recruiting for assistance. Contact Stephen du Bois for marshall related stuff, contact Kristin and James for everything else.

**Fletching and archery (Leona for Jois):** Receipts submitted to Exchequer.

**Archers' Brunch (Sol):** Cancelled in June due to full schedule.

**Brewing & Vinting (Robert):** Will be happening sometime.

**Cordials (Cianna):** Meeting on the first Tuesday. This week we need to find a volunteer to setup and host the annual Thursday night WW tasting. She can't do it because she is occupied with Media Relations responsibilities.

**Pottery Guild (Eliane):** The group is meeting sporadically and will be at All Fired Up at 6 p.m. this Monday. People can come and participate in any aspect of making things. She also has historic information available for people.

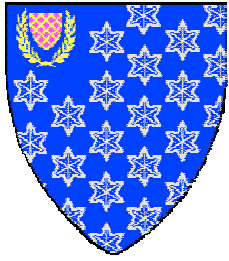

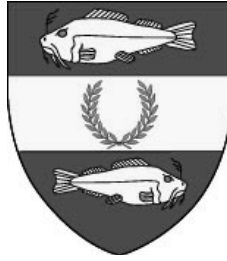

## VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

 1269: King Louis IX of France orders all Jews found in public without an identifying yellow badge to be fined ten livres of silver.  
 June 22, 1593: Battle of Sisak: Slovene - Croat troops defeat the Turks  
 June 23, 1305: Flemish-French peace treaty signed at Athis-sur-Orge.  
 1314: The Battle of Bannockburn. South of Stirling, Edward II of England & Robert I of Scotland met in battle. Scotland won and Edward fled the field and Scotland.  
 1532: Henry VIII & François I sign secret treaty against Emperor Charles V.  
 June 24: The celebration of Midsummer's Eve was from ancient times linked to the summer solstice. People believed that at midsummer plants had miraculous and healing powers and they therefore picked them on this night. Bonfires were lit to protect against evil spirits which were believed to roam freely when the sun was turning southwards again. It is one of the English quarter days (days on which servants were hired, and rents and rates were due.)  
 972 : Battle of Cedynia, near Cedynia. Polish forces have had their first documented victory.  
 1128: Battle of São Mamede, near Guimarães. Portuguese forces led by Alfonso I defeat his mother D.Teresa and D.Fernão Peres de Trava. After this battle, the future king calls himself "Prince of Portugal", the first step towards "official independence" in 1143.  
 1314: End of the Battle of Bannockburn. Scottish forces led by Robert the Bruce defeat Edward II of England. Scotland regains its independence.  
 1374: A sudden outbreak of St. John's Dance causes people in the streets of Aix-la-Chapelle, Prussia, to experience hallucinations and begin to jump and twitch uncontrollably until they collapse from exhaustion.  
 1497: John Cabot lands on North America in Newfoundland; first European discovery of the region since the Vikings.  
 1509: Henry VIII Crowned. Though proclaimed king two months earlier, a coronation was not conducted until June.  
 1520: Mass at Field of Cloth of Gold. Henry VIII of England and Francis I of France met between Guînes and Ardres near Calais to discuss an alliance. Since the nearby castles were in decay, temporary pavilions of such splendor were erected that the entire meeting area was called a "Cloth of Gold." At the end of more than a fortnight of cordial negotiations and entertainment, mass was said on Sunday, June 24, and the kings parted. Political results of the meeting were negligible.  
 1534: Jacques Cartier makes the European discovery of Prince Edward Island.  
 1597: The first Dutch voyage to the East Indies reaches Bantam (on Java).  
 June 25, 1530: The Augsburg Confession is presented at the Diet of Augsburg to the Holy Roman Emperor by the Lutheran princes and Electors of Germany.  
 June 26, 1284: According to legend, the Pied Piper lures 130 children of Hamelin away.  
 1409: Western Schism: The Catholic church is led into a double schism as Petros Philargos is crowned Pope Alexander V after the Council of Pisa, joining Pope Gregory XII in Rome and Pope Benedict XII in Avignon.  
 1483: Richard III becomes king of England.  
 June 27, 1542: Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo claims California for Spain.  
 June 28, 1098: Fighters of the First Crusade defeat Kerbogha of Mosul.  
 1243: Innocent IV becomes pope.  
 1389: Ottoman forces crush the armies of Christian Europe in Kosovo, opening the way for the Ottoman conquest of Southeastern Europe.

# THE ANTI-CALENDAR

(A listing of events that have already happened)

- June 1, 1192: Enrico Dandolo elected doge of Venice. Evidently in his 80s when he was elected, Dandolo is best known for his role in the Fourth Crusade, during which he arranged with French barons to transport their crusaders in return for the capture of the Christian town of Zara on the Dalmatian coast.
- 1283: Treaty of Rheinfelden: Duke Rudolph II of Austria has to waive his right to the Duchies of Austria and Styria.
- 1495: Friar John Cor records the first known batch of scotch whisky.
- 1533: Henry VIII of England's new wife, Anne Boleyn, is crowned as queen.
- June 2, 455 - The Vandals enter Rome, and plunder the city for two weeks.
- 1420: Henry V marries Catherine of Valois
- June 3, 1098: First Crusade: Antioch falls to the crusaders after an eight-month siege.
- 1140: French scholar Peter Abelard is found guilty of heresy.
- 1162: Thomas À Becket consecrated Archbishop. When Henry II appointed his old friend to this powerful post, he thought Becket would continue to support him in the ongoing struggle of state vs. church. Becket would soon prove otherwise.
- June 4, 1039: Henry III becomes King of Germany.
- June 6, 1508: Maximilian I, Holy Roman Emperor, is defeated in Friulia by Venetian forces; he is forced to sign a three-year truce and cede several territories to Venice
- 1513: Italian Wars: Battle of Novara. Swiss troops defeat the French under Louis de la Tremoille, forcing the French to abandon Milan. Duke Massimiliano Sforza is restored.
- 1523: Gustav Vasa is elected King of Sweden, marking the end of the Kalmar Union.
- June 7, 1099: Siege of Jerusalem begins. In this climax of the First Crusade, the Christian army encamped before the city and began the siege that was to result in the capture of the city more than a month later.
- 1494: Treaty of Tordesillas signed. The Treaty determined the longitudinal dividing line between all future territories acquired by the explorers of Spain and Portugal.
- June 8, 793: The first Viking raid on British soil at Lindisfarne where a set date for the raid is known
- 1405: First execution in England of a Bishop (Richard Scrope, Archbishop of York) by a King (Henry IV)
- June 10, 1190: Third Crusade: Frederick I Barbarossa drowns in the Saleph River while leading an army to Jerusalem.
- 1258: Provisions of Oxford issued. King Henry III of England, bankrupted by a venture in Sicily, summoned Parliament in the hopes of gaining a grant of funds. In return, he agreed to abide by a reform program devised by a royal commission; its report, considered England's first written constitution, is known as the Provisions of Oxford.
- June 11, 1509: Henry VIII marries Catherine of Aragon. After his father's death, and before he was officially crowned king, Henry took the widow of his brother Arthur to wife. The first marriage may never have been consummated, but Henry would later use it in his arguments for an annulment. The pope

- would not grant him his annulment, and his divorce from Catherine would result in a breach that spawned the English Reformation
- June 12, 1381: Peasants' Revolt: In England rebels arrive at Blackheath.
- 1418: An insurrection delivers Paris to the Burgundians.
- June 14, 1381: Richard II makes promises to rebels. The Peasants' Revolt had reached its boiling point when 20,000 rebels camped at the gates of London demanding changes in the oppressive English serf system. Militarily short-handed, the royal council sent the 14-year old king, Richard II, out to parley with the peasants. As he did so, a contingent of rebels led by Wat Tyler infiltrated London and proceeded to wreak havoc on the city.
- 1497: Juan Borgia murdered. The favorite son and heir of the notorious Pope Alexander VI, Juan was probably murdered by his older brother Cesare.
- June 15, 923: Battle of Soissons: King Robert I of France is killed and King Charles the Simple is arrested by the supporters of Duke Rudolph of Burgundy.
- 1215: King John signs the Magna Carta. Succumbing to pressure from the barons, John signed the document at Runnymede and declared that copies should be distributed and publicly read throughout England. While its initial impact was limited, the Magna Carta served as a significant precedent for future democratic government in the centuries to come.
- 1219: Dannebrog - oldest national flag in the world - and flag of Denmark. According to legend, fell from the sky during the Battle of Lyndanisse in Estonia, and turned the Danes' luck.
- 1246: With the death of Duke Frederick II, the Babenberg dynasty ends in Austria.
- 1389: Battle of Kosovo: The Ottoman Empire defeats Serbs and Bosnians.
- 1409: Western Schism: The Catholic church is led into a double schism as Petros Philargos is elected Pope Alexander V by the Council of Pisa, joining Pope Gregory XII in Rome and Pope Benedict XII in Avignon.
- 1520: Pope Leo X threatens to excommunicate Martin Luther.
- June 16, 1487: Battle of Stoke Field, the last dying breath of the Wars of the Roses
- 1586: Mary Queen of Scots recognizes Philip II of Spain as her heir
- June 17, 1194: Richard I crowned again. After having been held captive for two years by Emperor Henry VI, Richard felt it was necessary to demonstrate his sovereignty over England, and so he had a second coronation. Less than one month later he left the country, never to return.
- 1497: Battle of Deptford Bridge - Forces under King Henry VII soundly defeat rebellious Cornishmen led by Michael An Gof.
- 1579: Sir Francis Drake claims a land he calls Nova Albion (modern California) for England.
- June 18, 1053: Pope Leo IX taken prisoner by the Normans.
- 1155: Frederick Barbarossa crowned Emperor
- 1264: The Parliament of Ireland meets at Castledermot in County Kildare, the first definitively known meeting of this Irish legislature.
- 1429: The French, under the leadership of Joan of Arc, crush the English under Sir John Fastolf at the Battle of Patay. It came to be recognized as the war's turning point.
- June 19, 1097: Antioch falls to the crusaders. The long siege and capture of Antioch in the First Crusade delayed the crusaders' arrival in Jerusalem for more than a year. Even after its fall, it took several months before the last leg of the journey could begin.
- 1179: The Norwegian battle of Kalvskinnet outside Nidaros. Earl Erling Skakke
