## Directions to Hoyt Park:

FROM THE EAST--take your best route to Regent St. Head west on Regent, keep going past West High School and the cemeteries. Continue on Regent, it will take you into Hoyt Park. Keep driving past the sign for the park and the parking lot for the large park shelter (on your right), continue down the street as it meanders along. Eventually the houses on the left give way to an expanse of lawn with picnic tables and stone fireplaces. On the right, the woods with picnic tables and stone fireplaces drop away and a scenic overlook with parking for several cars appears just before the road starts to meander downhill. Park there. Go across the street to the table with the SCA people sitting at a table with a tablecloth.

FROM THE WEST--take your best route to Midvale Blvd. Turn onto Hillcrest, located halfway between the Mineral Point and Regent intersections. Go several blocks on Hillcrest and turn left onto Owen Parkway (note that you will pass Owen Dr. along the way). 

## SCIENTIFIC JARAVELLIAN



(or, if that's a warrant, then I've been framed!)

Good day, fair gentles, it is I, Scaramouche, with another load of ...I mean, with another science project to help beautify our domicile. Tell me, have you won any awards, warrants, or postings? Do you have some lovely scrolls, proclamations, or certificates filed away where no one will see them, or maybe thumbtacked to a wall? Well, this month I and my assistant will be showing you how to make simple, inexpensive frames for any and all applications.

A good material for frames is 2.5" to 3" wide wooden decorative molding or trim, available in a wide variety of patterns and designs from most lumber and hardware stores. Not much is necessary, except for larger "portrait" frames, so the price will be low.





The most important part of framing is to get the 45 degree angle perfect, so use a cutting jig if you have one. If not, here's how to make one: take 3 12" sections of 1x4 boards, and nail them together into a long U shape. Use a protractor to draw a 45 degree angle on the top of one arm and continue the line across onto the other arm. Make these marks near the middle of the jig. Draw a line straight down the outside of each arm from these marks, to use as a cutting guide. Slowly and carefully saw through these marks, keeping the saw perfectly perpendicular to the base of the U at all times. Stop cutting when the saw starts to bite into the base board. Test your new jig with some scrap wood first, cutting two boards at 45 degrees and see if they fit together into a perfect 90 degrees (use a square).



When cutting your molding, use two C-clamps (padded with rags to prevent scratches) to hold it flat against the base and one side of the jig. After cutting, sand down the edges with first coarse, then fine, sandpaper.



The inside dimensions of the frame are the most critical. The article you are framing will have to be bigger than the "window" made by the frame, but there should be a good inch or so between the inside edge of the frame and whatever image is on the paper (always leave a little more space on the bottom than the top and sides — it helps defeat the optical illusion that the bottom is smaller). If the article you're framing has image or text too close to the edge for this, you may want to cut out a mat of heavy construction paper or tagboard of a similar color as the scroll background, and tape the article onto the back.



Once you've figured out the dimensions, cut the four pieces of molding with the jig, and sand. Use a little wood glue to hold the pieces together and staple 3 or 4 times across each join on the back, with heavy but short (1/4" staples). Stain and/or lacquer the frame. To keep your scroll centered, staple four 1/2" wide strips of cardboard to the back, just around the scroll. You may want to cover the scroll with a sheet of



plastic or vinyl to protect it. Once everything is in place, cover the back with a piece of tagboard and staple it down around the edges. Staple a short piece of string or wire, with a little slack, along the top.

Frames can be hand painted, inset with plastic "gems" or small mirrors, covered with lacquered-over flowers, or even set with smaller locket-sized frames. Be creative.



That's about all for this month (Gristle, get back in your box). Now go bother someone else.
