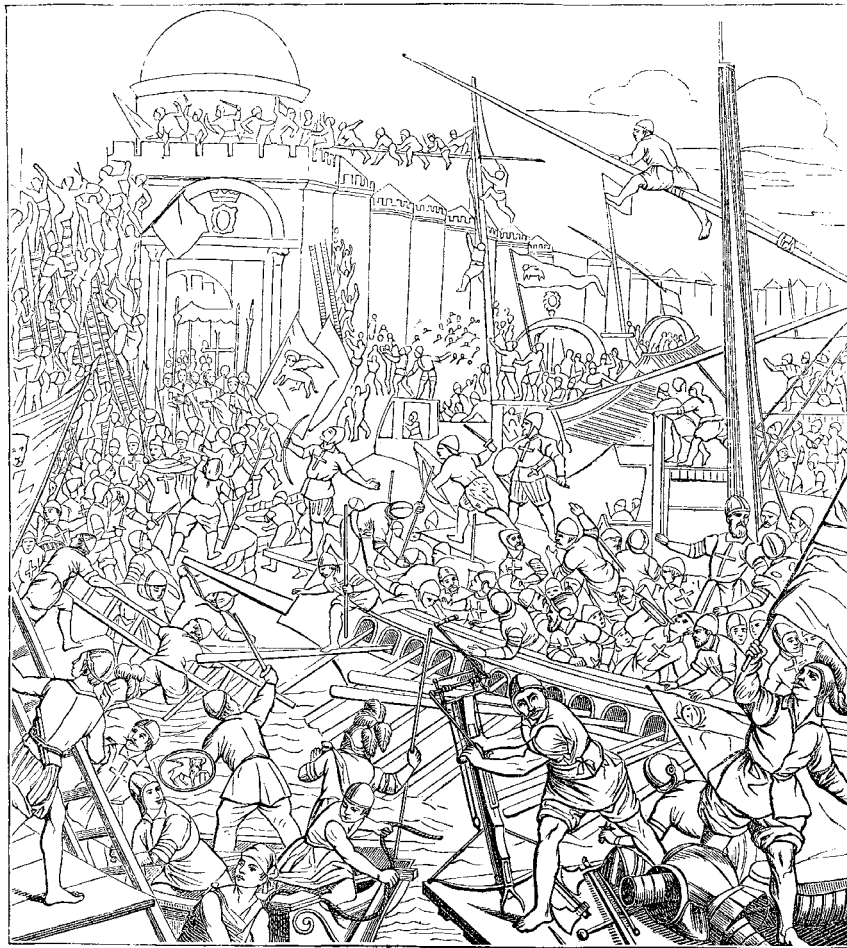

APRIL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

In attendance: Eithni, Paul Wickenden, Iohanna Carracci, Tatiana, Nikolaus der Ausländer, Calvin Patten, James Bird, Kristen Bird, Cosimo, Iohanna, Sol, Manigarm, Annora, Æsa, Eric, Kat, and Ivan Rezansky.

Outgoing Pursuivant (Svanhildr): My reports are in. I am nominating Karl to be my replacement as pursuivant.

Incoming Pursuivant (Karl): I have some background in book heraldry but I really like court heraldry and I have a good loud voice. **[The meeting voted to approve Karl as pursuivant; he will take over in May (not July as previously announced)]**

Incoming Knight Marshall (James): Fighting was fun yesterday. My nomination to the office is still pending **[Meeting approved James as Knight Marshall; he will take over at May Day]**

Outgoing Exchequer (Tatiana): My first quarter report is in the works. I am also stepping down as Exchequer in June and nominated my deputy Annora to the post last meeting **[Meeting approved her nomination to take effect in June]**

May Day (Tatiana): My household is working on May Day. Publicity for the event is running a little behind schedule. The web site will be done tonight. Arts and sciences is in works. James will take care of finding MIC. Archery is taken care of. We haven't had enough activity in thrown weapons to justify a championship this year. We're still trying to reach Tristan (without luck so far) to figure out rapier but may go ahead without his input. Music guild will look into providing live music during the May Pole. We are asking for a \$50 budget to cover drinks. The hours for the event are 10-8. We will be at the main shelter in Hoyt Park.

May Day (Kat): I will be autocratting May Day.

Eric: I'm co-autocratting May Day with Kat.

ARRG (Ivan): We contacted the Mermaids autocrat and their group's seneschal to see if we could conflict and they were not in favor of doing so (as they don't want to lose money). But they have offered to let us join with them as long as we kicked in money to help cover the expenses of the site.

ARRG (Cosimo): I have been looking into others sites (in order to find a place where we could hold the event on the May 22nd date). I found Columbus's Firemen's Park. The site fee is \$400 plus a \$200 security deposit (of which we will get \$125 back - with \$75 used for pavilion rental). In all, the cost of the event—with event expenses—would be around \$525, which is too much. [Tatiana and Svanhildr also suggested Waterloo's Firemen's park, but there was doubt that it would still be available]

ARRG (Eithni): If we want to combine with another event, combining with Border Skirmish would work better (there already is a high profile wedding at it for Edward of Kent). However, maybe we shouldn't do the event this year? [Meeting decided to table the event proposal and not hold ARRG this year]

Borrowing Loaner Bows (Manigarm): I am teaching an archery class for a women's retreat in the Dells on May 15th-16th. I would like to borrow the loaner bows so that they will have some lighter poundage bows with which to practice. We might be able to solicit a small donation in exchange for allowing them to use our equipment. Jois is OK with this. [Meeting approved]

Instrumental Music (Nikolaus): The guild is sputtering along. We had a new person (a 12 year old and father stopped by) but they haven't come back. I will ask the Guild on Monday if they want to perform at May Day.

High Seat (Æsa): Reinholdt gave Raito some human chess materials. Does anyone know what they are? [Meeting suggested that they might be from the Harry Potter demos]

UW Student Organization Coordinator (Æsa): Our current person is graduating and we need a new representative if we want to retain our status as a student organization. Is it worth doing so? How much do we save on Stock Pavilion fees, for example, by being a student organization? It is becoming harder to qualify since we don't have many student members.

Iohanna: We really do need to make more of an effort to recruit students and also to deal with an overall decline in membership and interest. This is a topic that we need to discuss more. I'd like to propose that we have a dedicated discussion at May Day during the afternoon.

May Day (Eric): If we're looking for more publicity, would it be OK for us to put announcements about May Day in the papers and maybe contact the news? [It would be OK to put announcements in, but contacting the media should be done through the Kingdom media relations person — check the Northshield website for more information]

Incoming Exchequer (Annora): Now that I'm going to be taking over, I'm looking for deputy (Tatiana will hold onto that role for now).

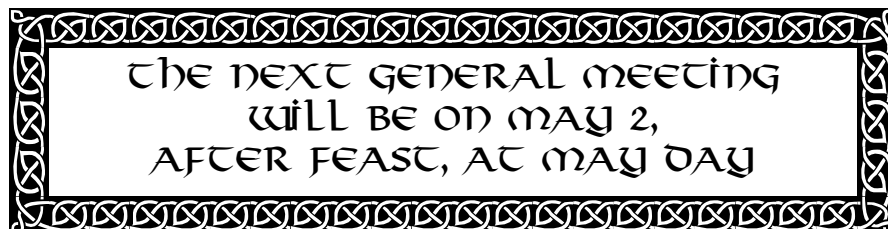
Iohanna: Nothing.

Stock Pavilion (Sol): We don't have the Stock Pavilion on April 25th. I will remind people on the List about it. We also still do not have a calendar for May. I plan to call the contact about that tomorrow (as well as asking about how not being a student org would affect our rental rates).

WW (Eithni): We had WW staff meeting yesterday and are now in high gear. I'll be bringing the budget next month. Among other things, we are redesigning the site layout. We will be moving fighting off to the side (where the terrain is more interesting). This will leave an open space in the middle of site which will be a Greens for special events. We are also going to break the A&S competition into sections (having performance and culinary stuff on Friday night, costuming and C&I on Saturday morning, and armoring/smithing on Saturday afternoon). I'll be sending out information this week. If you have ideas (particularly about how we could utilize the Green), now is the time to submit them.

Chronicler (Paul): I'm still looking for a deputy/replacement as my term is now up to five years. I'm also running an article in the *Skein* this month about the *Skein*, which consolidates the discussion that has been had so far. This discussion also ties in nicely to the topic of revitalizing the Barony that Iohanna has suggested. And, as always, please remember to get me stuff for the *Skein* by the Friday before General Meeting!

Seneschal (Ivan): Our next meeting will be at the May Day Moot. If you have business at that Meeting, please get me your topics in advance as we will have a set agenda for the Meeting to keep it under control. I'll be on vacation in the second half of April. While I am gone, Æsa will be my point of contact.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

A&S SHOWCASE AT MAY DAY

At the May Day Moot we wish to choose our A&S Champion. At the suggestion of our previous A&S Champion, Sol, the theme for this year's A&S Showcase, by which we will choose our Champion, is Inspiration. As a Champion should inspire others, so do we wish to be inspired by what we see and hear from our Champion.

What, exactly, does this mean? Before one is willing to put time and effort into creating a project, one must be inspired to do so. Inspiration may be a person you met, something you saw or read or heard, a class you attended or taught, or anything else. Please show us the process and product of what inspired you. Your project does not need to be completed, nor does it need to be successful. You do not need to be experienced and accomplished in the arts

and sciences to participate. Beginners are encouraged to enter and show us their enthusiasm. And, finally, it does not need to be a recent project -- inspiration from 20 years ago is just as valid as that from last year.

There does need to be some result to show, however. Inspiration that does not result in something concrete does not count as inspiration for the purposes of this activity. This can include performances as well as objects. Because of the nature of this event (we're choosing our Champion here), team entries are not allowed. More than one person can play a part, however it should be about one person's inspiration. Documentation of how you were inspired, as well as an explanation of your project's authenticity (i.e., how it is period), is strongly encouraged. We will speak to each entrant regardless of how much written information is provided.

If you have any questions about the Showcase, please contact Raito or Æsa. We will provide details soon about when the face-to-face portion will be held during the moot. If you plan to participate, we would love to know about it in advance, but pre-registration is not required.

CONCERNING THE SKEIN

At last month's General Meeting, I brought up a question that has been bothering me no small amount lately: What do we want the *Skein* to be? The question is relevant and timely because the level of interest in the *Skein* (as it currently is) has been waning in the past several years: the number of subscriptions have dropped, contributions are rare, and interest in serving in the post of Chronicler is non-existent. By any measure, the *Skein* is losing relevance.

One easy response to these challenges could be that, in this age where printed publications are folding up right and left, maybe we should retire the idea of a printed newsletter altogether. I'm personally reluctant to go with that idea because I believe it is useful to have a permanent record of our group and its activities. Back issues of the *Skein* have been very valuable to me as the Historian in describing what happened in the Barony even a few years ago. I would hate to lose that resource.

However, deciding to continue to produce a newsletter is not a commitment to business as usual. It is still valuable to reconsider what the *Skein* should be. So, after a brief brainstorm at the General Meeting, I took the question to the Jara List to see what people would say. I have distilled the responses I received, along with feedback I got at General Meeting, into a couple of ideas that I wanted to share with you here.

Format

If we move towards an electronic format (as we have in fact done in recent years), is there any reason to stick to the structure and presentation of our current paper-based publication?

The traditional half-fold newsletter is a restrictive format, bourn out of the requirements of photocopiers and standard paper sizes. Reproducing an electronic newsletter in the same format can be downright cumbersome and doesn't serve a clear purpose. For those who downloaded the March 2010 issue, you'll notice that I

repaginated it so you can at least read it online. However, it could be more web-friendly. Iohanna suggested that an on-line newsletter could be fronted by an email -- like a lot of vendors do now -- where a list of hyperlinks takes you to the articles you want to read. This, of course, would mean some extra (or different) work than is currently involved.

Content

The monthly paper newsletter is a format from a time before people could get their news at any moment. Nowadays, most people communicate by email and get their news online. For example, official communications may still get published in the *Northwatch* but given its time lag of over a month, it is hardly the source for current information. Similarly, the Jara List is a better medium for last minute schedule changes and information that needs to get out right away. So, as modern expectations have changed about the timeliness of news, a monthly newsletter can at best serve as a permanent record of information that has already been disseminated elsewhere.

As for content itself, a major cause of job fatigue for a chronicler is being responsible for all of the content. In the old days, one imagines that chroniclers had the luxury of sifting through abundant submissions and picking and choosing what they wanted. However, even in the past, chroniclers struggled to find enough material to fill the pages of their newsletters. Improving the content and its volume/variety are, however, part of a closed feedback loop: a high quality publication attracts good writers and good writers create a high quality publication. So, where does one begin?

The key, I believe, is easy-to-write but intrinsically interesting topics. And for the most part, the easiest thing to write about is oneself (and, coincidentally, it can also be the most interesting). Most of the specific suggestions I received from folks for new content ideas fall into this category:

- Polls
- Event reports -- what happened at a local event (who won the tourney, who had a special court happening, and other assorted "gossip" of the Current Middle Ages). As Sile put it nicely, "the stories of a given society of folks are part of what

binds it together culturally. It makes sense that a medium that spreads those stories would then be vital to the community."

- Baronial history
- Persona stories (and maybe something about the person's actual history in the SCA)

None of this is to say that articles about historical subjects, reenactment, and various crafts and arts don't have their place (*Tournaments Illuminated* and the *Complete Anachronist* have certainly largely subsisted on such material), but we probably need to think on less grandiose terms for a local newsletter.

Publicizing and Increasing Interest

And while improving the quality and relevance of the *Skein's* content is certainly a valuable step towards increasing its relevance and thus its popularity, there also needs to be some attention given towards increasing its profile. An optimist might note that the *Skein* is actually the most-visited part of the Baronial website, with each issue getting about 75-100 downloads in the first month (and about 40 downloads a month after that), according to our webminister, James. That's certainly a vote of confidence, but I believe we can do more.

It is a safe bet, after all, that only a small minority of the Barony is even aware that the *Skein* exists (and most of them are old-timers). The key, as Sile noted to me, is making the *Skein* something to talk about: "word of mouth will go further than any other form of publicizing - people will want to get their copy because it makes them laugh, or remember, or relate, in a way they find valuable."

Conclusions

What do you think? If you're reading this article, then you obviously care at least somewhat about the newsletter and you have an interest in the affairs of the Barony. How do *you* think the *Skein* could be improved? And how do we get there?
